



The Tynedale New Testament Visit & Lunch Friday 25th September 2026 ~10.30am Tickets ~ £60

2026 marks the 500th anniversary of William Tyndale's translation of the New Testament into English from the original Greek. For the very first time, the public will be able to see the book on display in St Paul's Cathedral and the Club is delighted to have secured a number of tickets to view this rare display.

The first edition was illegally published in 1526 and was referred to as a dangerous book by a dangerous man. In 1536 Tynedale died at the stake for his determination to make the bible available in the vernacular for all to read - from Princes to Ploughboys. The original copies were collected and burnt, however three copies survived, including that which is on display today.

The visit includes a guided tour of the Triforium Galleries, the Library with the Tyndale exhibits; including the New Testament and copies of five other early bibles, the spectacular Geometric Staircase and the room in which the Great Model of Wren's favoured design for St Paul's has been preserved for the last 300 years. Following the visit a light lunch will be served in the Disraeli Room.
